The objective of JDS is to support human resources development of Sri Lanka. Targeting young government officials, who are expected to be leaders of the country, and to engage in formulating and implementing social and economic development policies after their return. JDS Fellows shall contribute to an expanded and enhanced foundation for bilateral relations with Japan as persons having well-rounded knowledge of Japan.

Eligibility

- (1) To be citizens of Sri Lanka
- (2) Below the age of 40, as of April 1st 2025
- (3) Should have a good command of both written and spoken English
- (4) "Executives/Senior Executives", mentioned in the Public Administration Circular No.06/2006, Annexure II, Page 2, IV Senior Level, and Page 5, 3.10 & 3.11
- (5) Semi-government staffs (BOI, NBRO, CEA, NWSDB, WMA) can also apply under limited components
- (6) Applicants are expected to have special interest in studying in Japan as well as motivation to utilize their experience and human network developed through JDS in their career

I. Application Guidelines

1. About JDS Scholarship

The Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship (JDS) was launched by the Government of Sri Lanka with the assistance of the Government of Japan in 2000.



JDS is funded by the Government of Japan through its ODA (Official Development Assistance) budget.



JDS targets young government officials and others who are expected to play a leadership role in the development of their countries.



JDS provides scholarships to Sri Lanka government officers to study at two-year Master's Degree courses (instructed in English) of Japanese universities.

Objectives of JDS

- **To support Human Resource Development**
 JDS's objective is to strengthen the government's administrative capacities in Sri Lanka through providing the opportunity to obtain the Master's degree to the young capable government administrators who are expected to engage in formulating and implementing social and economic development plans and to play a leadership role in the development of the country.
- **To Enhance Bilateral Relationships**
 JDS fellows are expected to solidify foundations to further bilateral relations with Japan by utilizing their human network developed through academic and social activities while in Japan.

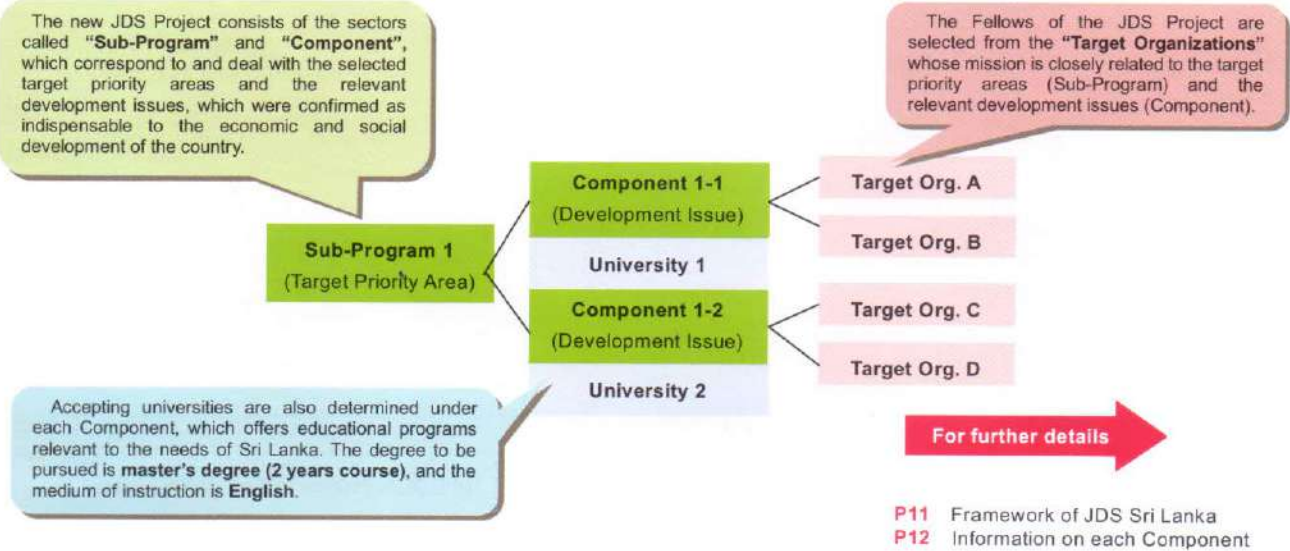
Beneficiaries of JDS

- **For the participants (JDS Fellows)**
 JDS Fellows will acquire expertise to use for policy making and institutional building for the development of their country, and also build human network in and out of Japan through the two-year study in Japan.
- **For the organizations (The Fellows' workplace)**
 The Fellows' workplace will attain highly-capable and motivated returnees (JDS Fellows) who can effectively contribute to the organizational missions.
- **For the Country (The Fellows' country)**
 The Fellows' country will improve institutional capability of the target organizations which leads to foster country's development.



2. System of JDS Sri Lanka

The framework of the JDS Project under the "New System" was made applicable to Sri Lanka in 2012. The new approach gives its importance on "selection and concentration" on the target priority issues to enhance effectiveness and efficiency of the program. A single program (One phase) is designed to accept four batches of Fellows (Fellows in each fiscal year constitute one batch).

7. Award Benefits

The awards are offered for the minimum period necessary for the individual to complete the academic program specified by JDS project. The following benefits generally apply:

- Full tuition fees
- Air fare
- Arrival allowance
- Accommodation allowance
- Monthly Scholarship
- Book allowance
- Travel and seminar attendance allowance
- Overseas travel insurance
- Supports from the agent
 - Finding accommodation
 - Initial settlement of your life in Japan
 - Emergency situation etc.



8. Important JDS Rules

JDS has specific rules in order to realize its project goals and to ensure favorable study environment for the Fellows.

Before departure

- JDS Fellows must submit a JDS pledge to the Operating Committee to commit themselves to follow JDS Rules.

During the stay in Japan

- If JDS Fellows wish to bring their family members to Japan, it is recommended to bring their family members to Japan only after 3 months from the date of arrival in Japan and after the date of admission.
- The Fellows are prohibited from
 - Working,
 - Driving motor vehicles, and
 - Applying for further studies such as a doctoral course in Japan.
- The Fellows must complete the study within the predetermined period of study, and return to his/her country immediately after the study completion.

After returning to home country

- The Fellows must attend a report back meeting held by the Operating Committee.
- The Fellows are obliged to **return and work within Sri Lanka at least for 8 (eight) years** in compliance with the Act of Pledge (Bond) required by each belonging Ministry.

Further details will be explained in an orientation conducted after the selection.

- Please print out all the documents single-sided.
- All documents written in other language than English need official English translation. (Self-translation is not acceptable.)
- Use only A4 size paper for all copy sets.
- Do not staple the documents. Put a paperclip on them instead.
- Make your own extra copy of the Application Documents before submission.

2. Tips on Application and Selection (Reference)

The better you prepare for the Application Documents, the more chances to pass the selection you have.

Here are some tips on the preparation of Application Form (AF) and Research Plan (RP).



Before making the application documents, you are advised to...

Collect information, Analyse the information, and Analyse yourself!



Q6. Responsibilities of your work
Q7. Research Plan
Q8. Reason for applying the Graduate School
Q9. Future contribution

In answering the questions, it is very important to keep in mind that **those questions are NOT separate questions** - they are very coherent in the sense that each question asks [who you are / what you are doing now], [what you want to do in Japan] and [what you can / want to do after your study]. Therefore, those questions ask how you relate your career and the study in the context of the development of Sri Lanka.

Warnings about "Plagiarism"

"Plagiarism" is a serious offense in the academic field. **Plagiarism** means using other person's ideas and words without explicitly acknowledging the source of that information.

You may be disqualified from the selection, or even be discharged from the university, if the plagiarism is found in your research plan, or academic work at the university.

Such cases are deemed as plagiarism:

- Copying from books or article's written by other authors without permission
- Copying from an internet source without referring to the attribution text or information
- Misrepresentation of someone's work as one's original

To avoid plagiarism, you must cite sources and give credit whenever you use:

- Other person's idea, opinion, or theory
- Any facts, statistics, graphs, drawings – any pieces of information – that are not common knowledge
- Quotation of other person's spoken or written words, or
- **Paraphrase*** of other person's spoken or written words

* Paraphrase is a re-expression of other person's ideas in your own word



4. FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

Program

Q1. Is JDS a full scholarship?

YES. All the costs to study in Japan will be fully covered by JDS. For further details, please refer to "Award Benefits" in this booklet.

Q2. Do you have a Ph.D course?

YES. Ph.D. courses are offered in Sri Lanka

Q3. Is this an online course?

NO. The JDS fellows will study in Japan. It's a good opportunity to meet and learn with different people from around the world.

Q4. Can I apply for any university/course in Japan?

NO. The component and university are determined according to the priority development issues of each JDS recipient country. You can select the component/university from the framework.

Q5. Can I extend my stay after the completion of a program?

NO. Every JDS Fellow MUST return to their country by the designated date after graduation in compliance with the pledge required by the JDS Operating Committee. JDS Fellows have an obligation to return to the belonging organization and contribute to the socio-economic development of the country with acquired knowledge and skills.

Eligibility

Q6. I am working for a private company, but I have work experience at a government office. Am I eligible?

NO. The requirements are "Currently employed in the Target Organizations as a full-time employee".

Q7. I graduated from more than 2 universities. Do I need to submit diploma/transcript for all universities?

YES. Please submit both documents for all universities written down in Educational Background in the Application Form.

Q8. I have already received a scholarship from another country. Am I eligible to apply for JDS?

The following persons are NOT eligible to apply for JDS.

- Persons who are currently receiving or is scheduled to receive other scholarship
- Persons who had already obtained master's degree in other countries under any scholarship.

(*) However, persons who are studying in master's course or obtained master's degree without foreign assistance in local/foreign universities are eligible.

Q10. Can I apply for two components (universities)?

NO. You cannot apply for more than one component. Please select one component which is relevant to your work responsibility.

Q11. Should I submit all the application documents by the deadline?

YES. But in case you cannot submit some of the documents due to unavoidable reasons, please inform JICE in advance and submit the letter of reason with your signature.

Q12. I cannot get a permission letter from my workplace. Can I apply without the letter?

NO. In JDS, it is important to return to the workplace after study completion. Therefore, the permission from the workplace is required.

Selection

Q13. Do I need to take the English test?

YES. Basically, every applicant must take the English examination (IELTS). However, applicants who have valid IELTS score will be exempted from the English test. If you don't have a valid score, JICE will arrange the English exam.

Q14. Is the Math test required when applying for any University?

Yes. The math test is required for all applicants, regardless of their applying University.

Q15. Do I need to come to Colombo for the interview?

YES. For the applicants from the local island, JICE will provide a transportation subsidy.

Q16. How can I know the selection result?

After each selection, JICE JDS Project Office will notify the result to candidates who passed by email.

<p>In Sri Lanka, it is an urgent issue to deal with budget deficits caused by long-standing conflicts and the bloated public sector, the outstanding amount of public debt reaching 90% of GDP (2019), and the outstanding amount of public external debt, which has remained above 50% of GDP. It is working on the development of guidelines and laws related to fiscal management, including expenditure / budget planning under fiscal discipline and strengthening of revenue security. Furthermore, in order to realize economic and financial soundness through the efficient development of social infrastructure including appropriate public investment management and private investment, and the promotion of high added value of domestic and overseas investment and industry, it is necessary to develop human resources who support the construction and operation of strategic public finance management systems across the public sector.</p> <p>Besides the efficient public investment management of economic infrastructure (airports, roads, railways, ports, water and sewage, electricity, telecommunications, etc.) and social infrastructure (schools, hospitals, etc.), there is a need to develop human resources who have the knowledge and expertise for public fiscal management, including expenditure planning, budgeting, revenue management, and securing accountability, and can contribute to institutional improvement and public sector reform, strengthening the operation of the country's economic and social development.</p>

Purpose of Study	
<p>In the industry of Sri Lanka, agriculture and manufacturing account for about 10% and 20%, respectively, and service industries account for about 60% of GDP. However, the industrial structure has not advanced for many years, and the export-oriented manufacturing industry other than the apparel industry has not developed sufficiently. In order to continue its further economic growth, it is necessary to shift its structure from a relatively inexpensive labor and capital-dependent industry to a high-value-added and productive industry utilizing foreign direct investment (FDI). It is also important to develop policy and regulatory frameworks to maximize the potential of FDI, including the use of the development goals in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.</p> <p>Regarding the investment environment in Sri Lanka, it is ranked 99th out of 190 countries in the World Bank's "Doing Business 2020", and factors that hinder investment have been pointed out, such as the business environment being unpredictable, mismatch in human resources, a complicated legal system, policies and procedures including the tax system, and a significant improvement in the investment environment is required. It is an urgent issue to develop human resources who have expertise in industrial development policies and investment environment improvement, which are expected to contribute greatly to the improvement of the economic environment, and can be reflected in policies and enforced.</p>

Purpose of Study	
<p>Regarding the economic growth in recent years, economic activities in the western provinces, mainly in Colombo, account for 40% of GDP by province (2018), and the economic gap between urban and rural areas is on an increasing trend. In urban areas where the population is concentrated, there are issues such as measures against traffic jams and traffic accidents by improving the efficiency of transportation systems, development plans to prepare for vulnerabilities caused by climate change and natural disasters, and the introduction of safety and environmentally friendly infrastructure. In addition, in order to stimulate regional economic activities that do not have sufficient ripple effects in urban areas, it is necessary to strengthen policy and institutional design and planning capabilities to promote the securing of financial resources for regional development, industrial development through the introduction of private capital, and the development of social infrastructure.</p> <p>The challenge is to develop human resources who will lead the formulation and implementation of policies that meet medium- to long-term needs by analyzing the challenges of correcting economic disparities between cities and regions and realizing a balanced development plan for the country as a whole.</p>	

III. Special Training and Events

JDS Program provides the following opportunities for JDS Fellows only in addition to research at university.

Government Leaders Networking Event

This special event aims to establish long-term cooperative relationships between JDS Fellows and Japanese government officials by providing opportunities of interaction and mutual learning. JDS Fellows participate in the event and expand their personal networks with Japanese government officials, who would become their counterparts in the future.



Japanese Language Training

All JDS Fellows participate in Japanese language training after their arrival in Japan. This training provides the Fellows with the lessons on Japanese characters (*hiragana, katakana, and kanji*), greetings, and how to introduce themselves. In addition, they deepen their understandings of Japanese culture, lifestyle and manners, and learn the procedures necessary for staying in Japan such as government office, post office, and bank.



JDS Pre-return Program

JDS Pre-return Program is held half a year before returning home, inviting all JDS fellows from each university.

During this program, the Fellows have opportunities to attend a series of programs, including leadership programs and a special lecture given by a prominent scholar. It also helps them build a network with JDS fellows from various countries.
